# Wednesday January 14, 7-10pm MÉLISANDE [ELECTROTRAD] (Canada)

Having just taken out Best Traditional Vocalist at the Canadian Folk Music Awards 2014, this hot quartet combine classic folk with modern electronic sensibilities, singing in French and English.

# Thursday January 15, 7-10pm David Francey Trio (Canada)

David Francey is a Scottish-born Canadian carpenter-turned-songwriter who has become known as "one of Canada's most revered folk poets and singers" (Toronto Star). David's straightforward songs tell honest stories of real people and real places. Poetic perception and a keen eye for the heart of the matter are trademarks of the man and his music.

# Friday January 16, 7-10pm

#### Debashish Bhattacharya (India) with The Chordwainers

A truly global musician of modern India, Debashish formed a new approach to the slide guitar rendition of raga music. By Indianising the foreign instrument, Debashish developed an entirely new technique of tuning and playing raga music on the Hindustani slide

guitar. He has won the BBC Planet Award for World Music and was nominated for a Grammy. The Chordwainers are a wind and percussion ensemble that play leather sculptural instruments created by renowned Tasmanian artist Garry Greenwood.

## Saturday January 17, 7-10pm Emma Dean and the Hungry Truth with Francesca de Valence

Emma's electrifying voice tells a rich story of personal experiences and emotions from a life on the stage. Her voice collides with the band's intricate rhythms, rich harmonies and distinctive instrumentation. Francesca de Valence is a breathtaking talent on the Australian scene. With outstanding chops on piano and a crystalline voice she recalls some of the greats such as Carole King and Sarah McI achlan.

# Sunday January 18, 7-10pm Ruth Roshan and Tango Noir

When Australian classical mandolinist Ruth Roshan was introduced to live Argentinean Tango in Paris at the age of 23, she was hooked. Now bringing you the atmosphere of a 1930s French salon, laden with flair, elegance and sauciness, Ruth Roshan and Tango Noir take you on a musical journey into the thrilling world of tango.


