Welcome to Country

Ya pulingina karati mapali. Welcome many friends.

Waranta lumi milaythina Mumirimina-ta. We are in the land of the Mumirimina people.

The Mumirimina people of the Oyster Bay tribe were interconnected with land and waterways, skies, people, animals, and ancestors for at least 47,000 years. The Mumirimina fought and died resisting colonisation. Their land was never ceded.

Please find your way to pay respect to the Mumirimina people who are no longer here.

The Palawa community in Lutruwita are the ongoing custodians of these lands. Truth Telling and Treaty are pursued as pathways to healing and justice. Our stories lie in the land, and song and dance and language thrive today. We embrace cultural values for caring for country and share knowledge in keeping country healthy.

Join us in paying respect to Palawa elders past and present.

Now – pause a moment – take in a breath – taste the salt on your tongue from *Timtumili minanya* (Derwent River) flowing, and see the sparkling waters in the bay around *Kipanta* (Kangaroo Point).

Be mindful of *ruwinana* the seagull who does not need your food, hear *payarrwinina* the magpie, and *minungkana* the black cockatoo, and see *kaylarunya* the black swan glide to shore where *matharitina* the blue tongue and *trimanya* the echidna stay hidden.

May you rejoice as *tiyuratina* the wind carries your music *milaythina manina milaythina muka* (across land and sea).

Safe travels home whether near or far until we see you again.




